.NET and Java programmers are very much in demand

40 percent of the San Diego companies plan to hire more employees, according to staffing experts. That's one encouraging measure of the current health of the region's economy. In the tech arena, 11 percent of San Diego-area CIOs interviewed said they plan to hire new staff in the first quarter of 2008.

According to another study, the average San Diego IT job pays \$75,994, down a disappointing 4.31 percent on the year and barely ahead of the national average.

Web developers, business intelligence analysts, and network security administrators are some of the skills in high demand.

IT Jobs Growth through 2016

The Bureau Labor Statistics (BLS) predicts that the fastest growing IT occupations will be in Network Systems Analysts, Data Communications Analysts, Computer Software Engineers, Systems Analysts, and Network and Systems Administrators.

To succeed in IT, Dr. L. Kappelman, professor of information systems at the University of North Texas College Of Business, recommends thinking beyond mastering technical or communication skills.
